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
A Final Word

2011 Year of the Child

What an exciting time to be a missionary to children! When we started out over twenty years ago it was not common to specialize in kids ministries. Not so anymore. This year has been designated by ours along with many other denominations and missions agencies as a year to focus on children.

For our monthly seminar for children's ministries leaders in January we combined with leaders

and teachers from the Christian Education Department. All of us are focusing on the International Year of the Child for 2011. I shared a seminar on the "4/14 Window" (age range: four to fourteen) movement presented by Dr. Luis Bush. He is the same missiologist who coined the term "10/40 Window" to reach many unreached people groups (please see *A Final Word*).

The following week at the AG Annual Business Session I shared a short video and promoted the resource material we had compiled on CD for the seminar on the Year of the Child. The CD was in high demand. During the past several months we have shared the 4/14 Window principles with *Alfalit*, a ministry that encourages reading and literacy using Christian materials, in church missions conference setting, and at various local church teacher training seminars. It's great to see a groundswell of interest in reaching and discipling this generation of children.

For the April leaders seminar, I had diligently prepared, but I honestly didn't feel a spark in my heart about what to share, like I usually



do. I felt kind of guilty and asked the Lord what was wrong with me? As the day unfolded, I began to learn again I need to trust that the Spirit plans better than we do. He sent one of our national missionaries who ministers in Haiti, Itzel (pictured here while video plays), to our seminar. God had spoken to her to go to the seminar "just in case" she could share something. A record number of 202 new believers were baptized in the river on Thursday! I was privileged to baptize about a dozen children from that group. It's a great year to reach kids!
