Please join us in praying for our Panamá AG leadership, pastors, churches and members. Many staff personnel are furloughed; churches meet virtually, or not at all; strict quarantine measures cost many people their jobs and income. Despite these hardships, training and instruction continues via Facebook live and Zoom meetings, for those who have access. The 4/14 window movement (Ventana 4/14) focusing on children ages 4 to 14 is "raising up a new generation in Panamá, and the rest of the world!"



Once we are able to return to minister in Panama, we will have to figure out how to make use of these new technologies, and combine them with time-

honored "old-fashioned" methods. We pray daily for wisdom how best to proceed right now here in the US and once back in our beloved Panamá.
