

Seed and Bread

When we offer ourselves as sowers to the Master of the Harvest, He places seed in our hands to grow His kingdom. "Bread" represents the reward for our labor, ie. a paycheck. "Seed" represents unexpected resources. If we "eat" our seed, we deny God the opportunity to use us as sowers. As we faithfully sow that seed in the Kingdom, then God can give us more to multiply the harvest. It has been gratifying to see that principle applied during this itineration cycle.

Itineration

The downturn in the economy has impacted churches as people face economic challenges. We hurt with these pastors and congregations. That makes their sacrificial contributions of any size that much more significant. While we have received word of decreased or eliminated support from some churches, we are encouraged by recent reports following several Missions Conventions from this first quarter. Pastors tell us that their people responded with noticeable increase in their pledged missions support, despite the downturn. We trust the Lord will honor their bold faith and provide even more seed for sowing the Word around the world!

For us, the cash budget is coming in. We have a little under half of the \$56,521 needed. The monthly support budget still lacks about \$1300

of the \$10,689 needed. We are trusting God and still aiming for a late summer return to Panamá, before the school year begins. If you have been considering a new or increased commitment to our ministry, we could really use it now.


